

Attendance News

We had some concerns towards the end of this half term with the amount of students arriving late to school. We are especially disappointed to see that an increasing number of pupils in year 11 are arriving late to school, stating reasons such as "woke late" or "missed the bus"; this is not acceptable.

We will be closely monitoring and hope to see a major improvement. I'm sure you appreciate that this is an extremely important year and hope we can count on your support. Can I also remind you that prospective colleges, employers and 6th Forms ask the School to provide references, which also include pupil's attendance records.

Please be reminded of our Punctuality Policy below:

- We have a very strict policy when dealing with lateness.
- There is a direct link between lateness to school and progress. We want to minimise barriers to Pupils' achievement and valuable learning time is lost when arriving late to school. Furthermore, their late entry to class interrupts teaching and disturbs the learning of others.
- We ask that you support your child to leave the house and get to school on time, allowing for the fact that we live in London and traffic can cause congestion in the morning.
- All Pupils need to be in the school playground by 8.20am to enable them to get into the school building and to lessons on time. Pupils need to be in class ready to learn at 8.30am.
- The gates in Highfield Road and Firs Lane close, and automatically lock, at 8.30am. After this time, Pupils must go to the Laburnum Grove entrance at the front of school and sign in at the Attendance Office, where they will be issued a late slip to enter their lesson.
- Late Pupils will be issued with a half hour lunch detention that same day. Failure to attend will lead to an hour's detention after school on a Friday

Word of the Week: Lackadaisical

Word Class	Adjective
Meaning	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy
Examples	- A lackadaisical defence left Manchester United adrift in the second half Taking a lackadaisical approach can jeopardize the success of a project."
Challenge	How many different words can you make with the letters in 'lackadaisical'? L - A - C - K - A - D - A - I - S - I - C - A - L E.g. lack, call

What's the challenge? You must use the 'word of the week' in the correct context (where possible) in any of your subjects. If you are able to use it in the correct context (not just going up to your teacher and saying it – has to be relevant to what you are doing), you will get I 'word of the week' achievement point.

Why are we doing this? To widen our vocabulary, oracy and understanding alongside encouraging a love for literacy across the school (in all subject areas).

Remember: that the student with the most 'word of the week' achievement points in the year group at the end of the half term will receive a voucher!


