'WINCHMORE'S WORD OF THE WEEK' CHALLENGE - week beginning 7th May:

Word of the Week: **Paraphrase**

Word Class	Verb
Meaning	To repeat something written or spoken using different words, often in a humorous form or in a simpler and shorter form that makes the original meaning clearer
Examples	- During the writing workshop, the teacher instructed the students to paraphrase the passage to demonstrate their understanding of the text.
	- When studying for exams, it's helpful to paraphrase textbook passages in your own words to aid comprehension.
	- When solving complex mathematical problems, it's essential to paraphrase the problem statement to break it down into simpler terms and better understand the underlying concepts.
Challenge	Have a go at the Spelling Bee https://www.nytimes.com/puzzles/spelling-bee

What's the challenge? You must use the 'word of the week' in the correct context (where possible) in any of your subjects. If you are able to use it in the correct context (not just going up to your teacher and saying it – has to be relevant to what you are doing), you will get I 'word of the week' achievement point.

Why are we doing this? To widen our vocabulary, oracy and understanding alongside encouraging a love for literacy across the school (in all subject areas).

Remember: that the student with the most 'word of the week' achievement points in the year group at the end of the half term will receive a voucher!


