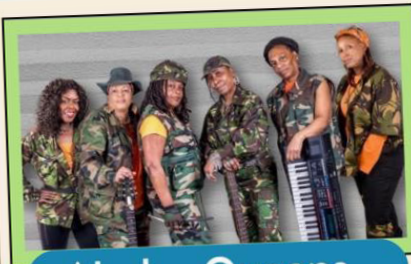

## What are you Reading?

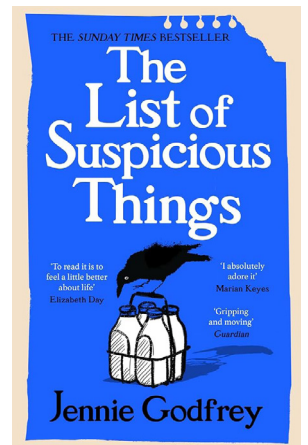
I'm Miss Falconer and I am the Literacy Coordinator at Winchmore School.

### The List of Suspicious Things by Jennie Godfrey

Set in Yorkshire in the 1970's, it follows 12-year-old Miv, who decides to make Yorkshire safe again by finding the man dubbed the Yorkshire Ripper, to avoid her father moving the family to London. Miv and her best friend, Sharon, start their own list of 'suspicious things' but they discover secrets about the people in their small town, with devastating consequences. The book is narrated by 12 yr old Miv and has a really nostalgic feel to it, capturing elements of childhood well. It also addresses issues that were prevalent at the time but never really discussed, like misogyny, mental health and racism, against the backdrop of the real fear that the Yorkshire Ripper murders provoked. Despite tackling such serious topics 'The List of Suspicious Things' is a funny, bittersweet, enjoyable read.

- Try to determine the trajectory of the ball as it flies through the air John's behaviour seems to be on a downward trajectory.
  - The book's plot takes an intriguing trajectory, full of twists and turns.
  - GCSE Physics : A football is kicked at an angle of 30° to the horizontal with an initial speed of 15 m/s.
    - What is the trajectory of the ball, and how does the angle of projection affect its path
    - Calculate the maximum height the ball reaches

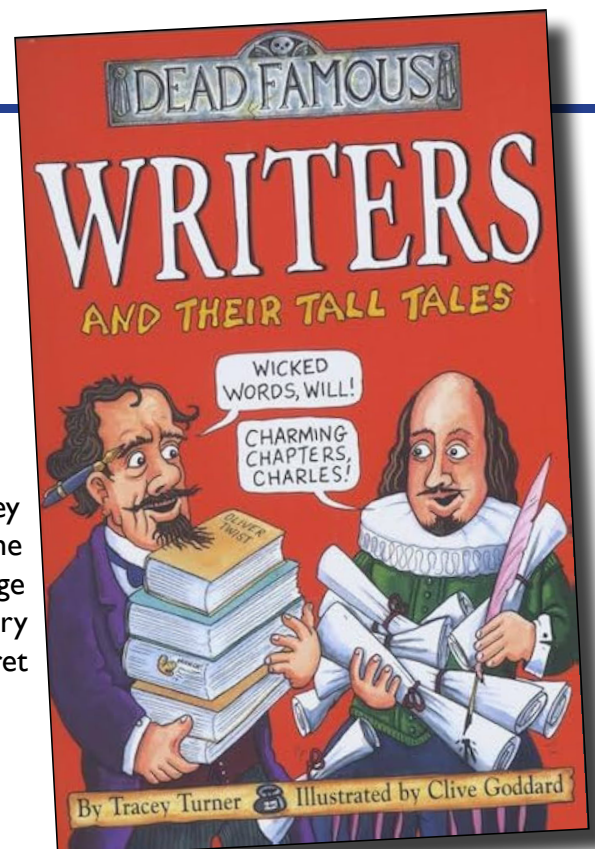

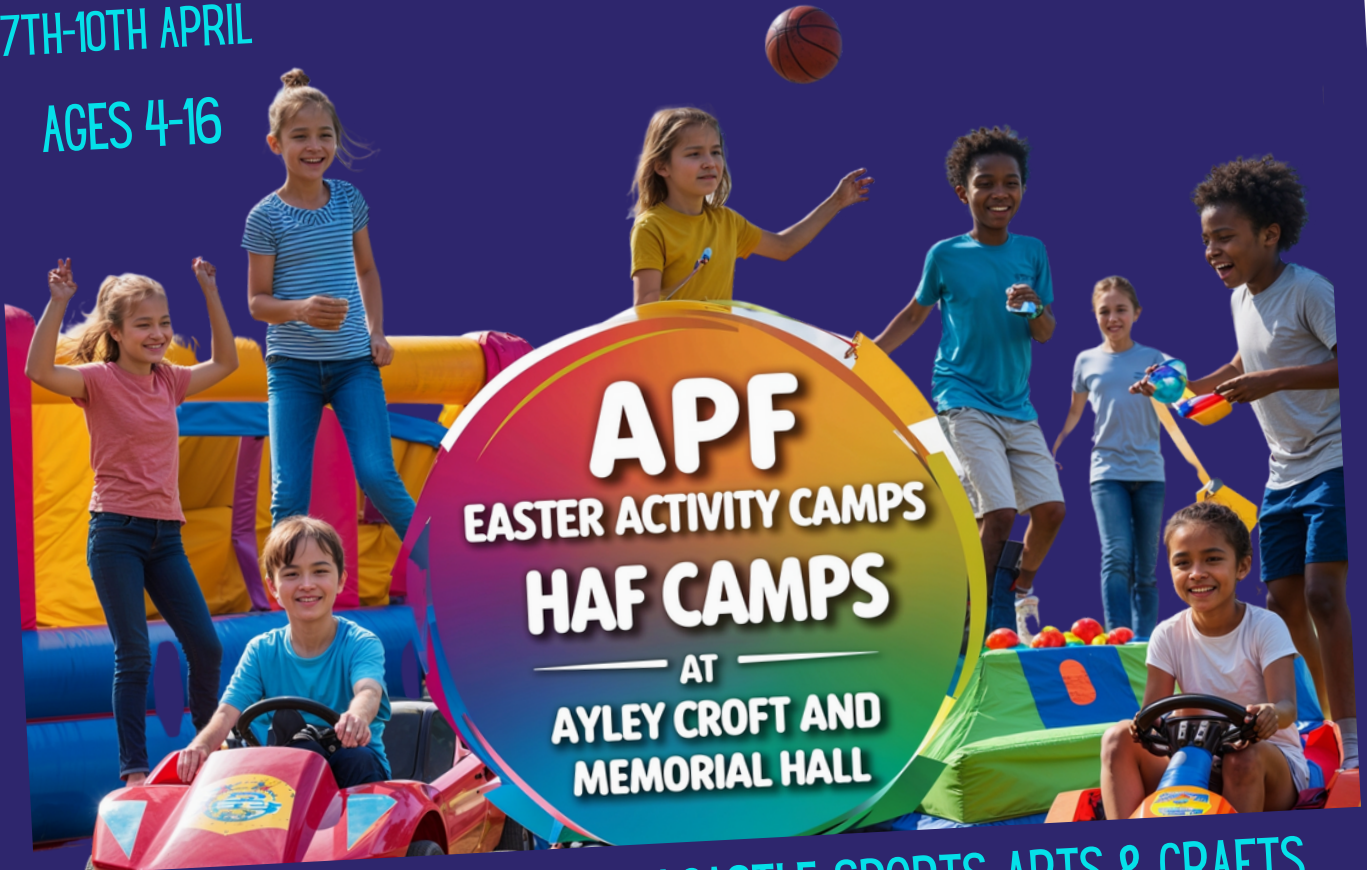
