I'm Miss Falconer and I am the Literacy Coordinator at Winchmore School.

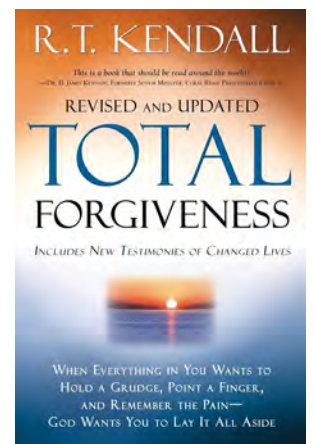

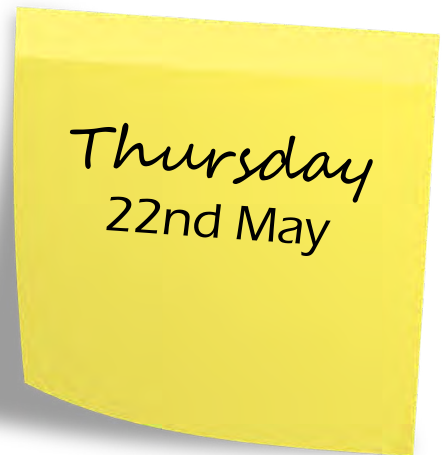

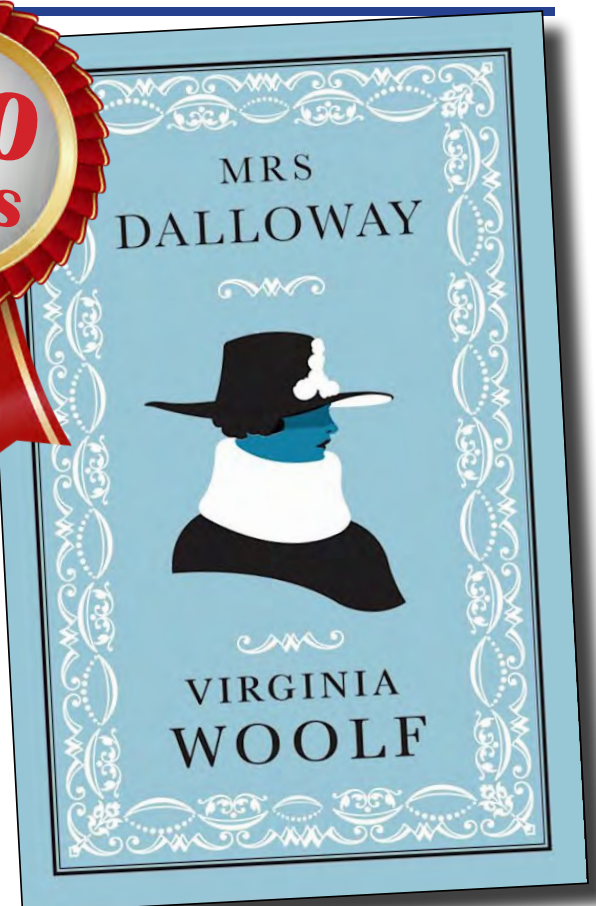
