## GCSE Exams & Preparation sessions Schedule

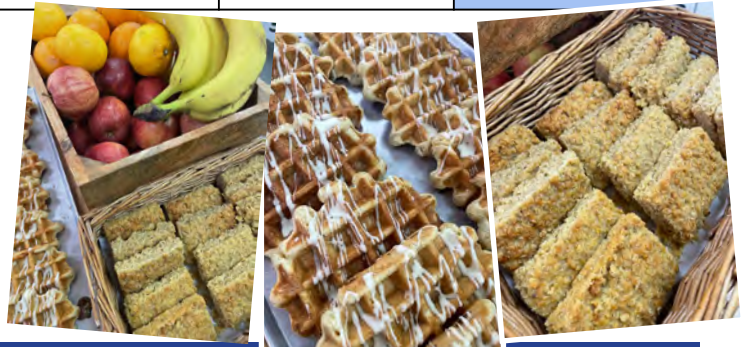

- **Have all your equipment ready** - Please bring all relevant equipment to each exam! 2 black pens, calculator, geometry set, ruler, highlighter etc. in a clear plastic pencil case/bag.
- **Lanyards must be worn** - so Invigilators can identify you.

I'm Miss Falconer and I am the Literacy Coordinator at Winchmore School.

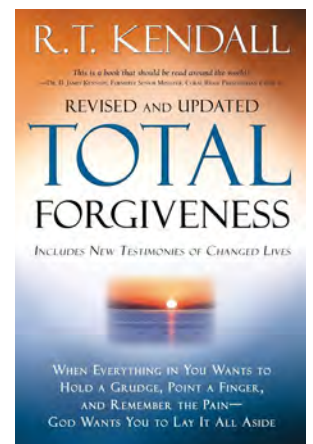

Week beginning 6th May



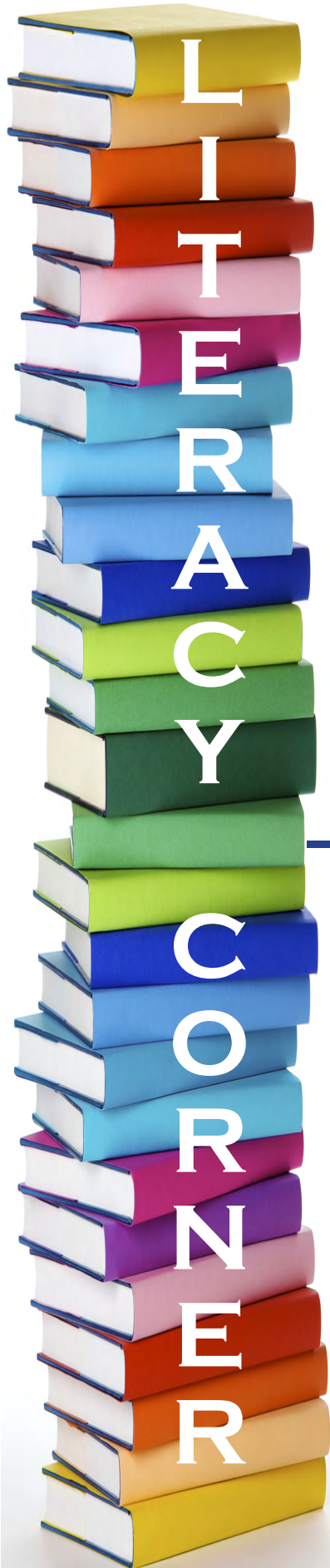
**Word Class** Noun
