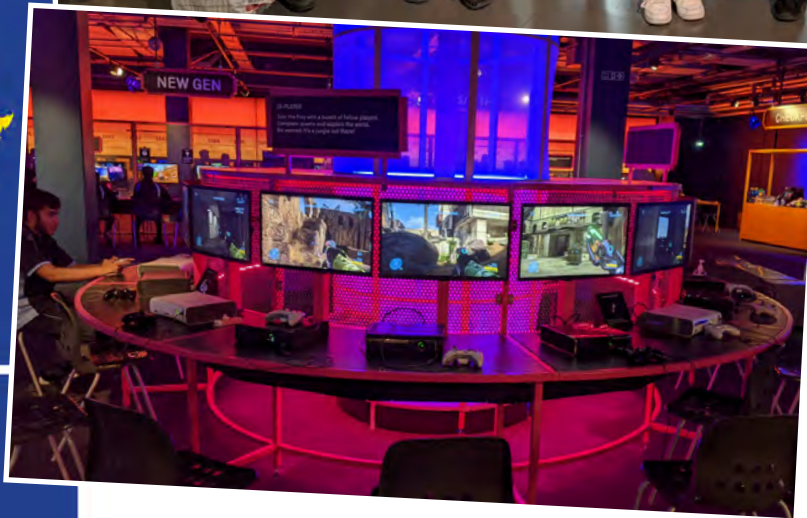




Power Up at the Science Museum



A group of 30 enthusiastic year 8 and 9 students were given the opportunity of a lifetime last week as they travelled to London to take part in Power Up, the interactive gaming experience hosted at the Science Museum.

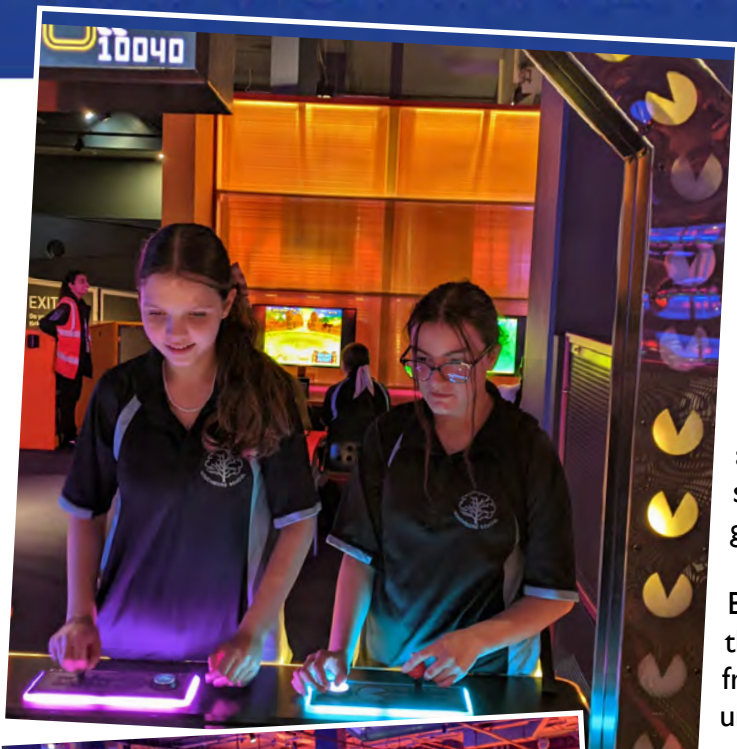
Having eaten lunch, to then enter the Power Up arena, the students were immediately immersed in a dazzling showcase

of gaming history, with the event boasting everything from retro consoles like the original Atari and Nintendo 64 to the very latest in modern gaming systems. The air buzzed with excitement as students got hands-on with hundreds of games spanning four decades, enjoying classics like Pac-Man, Street Fighter, and Sonic the Hedgehog, alongside newer titles such as Minecraft, FIFA, and Mario Kart 8 Deluxe.

One of the biggest highlights of the visit was the chance to experience virtual reality. With

VR headsets offering an entirely new dimension to gaming, many students were left awestruck by the level of immersion and innovation on display. From rhythm-based games to virtual adventures, the students explored digital worlds in ways that sparked their curiosity and imagination.

In addition to the games, students were able to learn about the evolution of gaming technology and its links to science, engineering, and design, reinforcing the museum's goal of combining entertainment with education.

But it wasn't just the event that earned praise — it was the students themselves. Throughout the journey to and from the venue, their exemplary behaviour did not go unnoticed. Commuters on the train commented positively, expressing how polite, well-mannered, and respectful the students were during the trip. "It was fantastic to see how engaged and well-behaved our students were," said one of the commuters. "They represented the school with pride, and it was heartening to hear these compliments from members of the public."



The trip was not only a fun and educational experience, but a proud moment for the school community — a reminder that learning can happen anywhere, especially when curiosity and respect go hand in hand.

Through the Journeys and Places programme, Enfield Council supports schools to encourage walking, wheeling and cycling amongst students, parents and staff.
