 Location - Sports Hall, Gym
Students arrive in Sports Hall Playground at 11:15 for an 11:30 start (12:00 for 12:15 start on 18th June)
Students will be dismissed at the end of the exam back to lessons/lunch

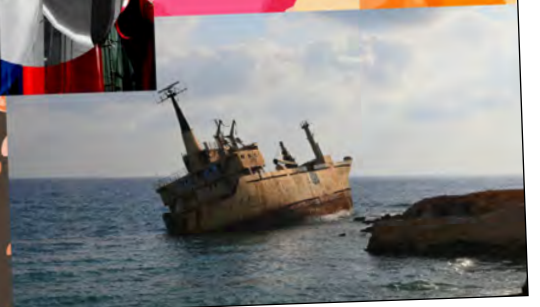
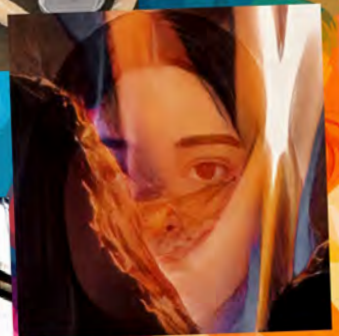
