Welcome back Year 9

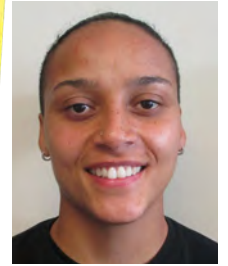

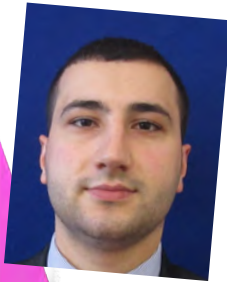

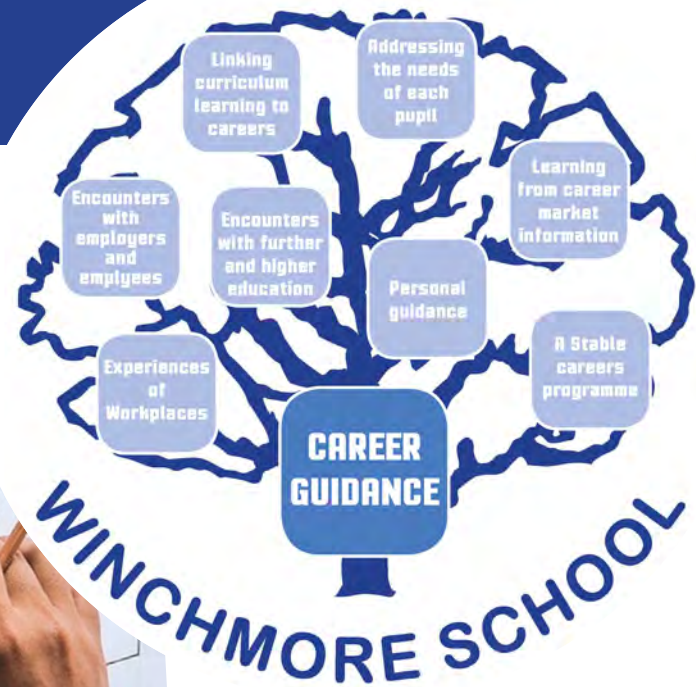
