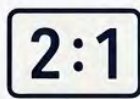

Due to an increase in supplier costs, we have to slightly alter the prices for our PE shorts and PE sports socks.

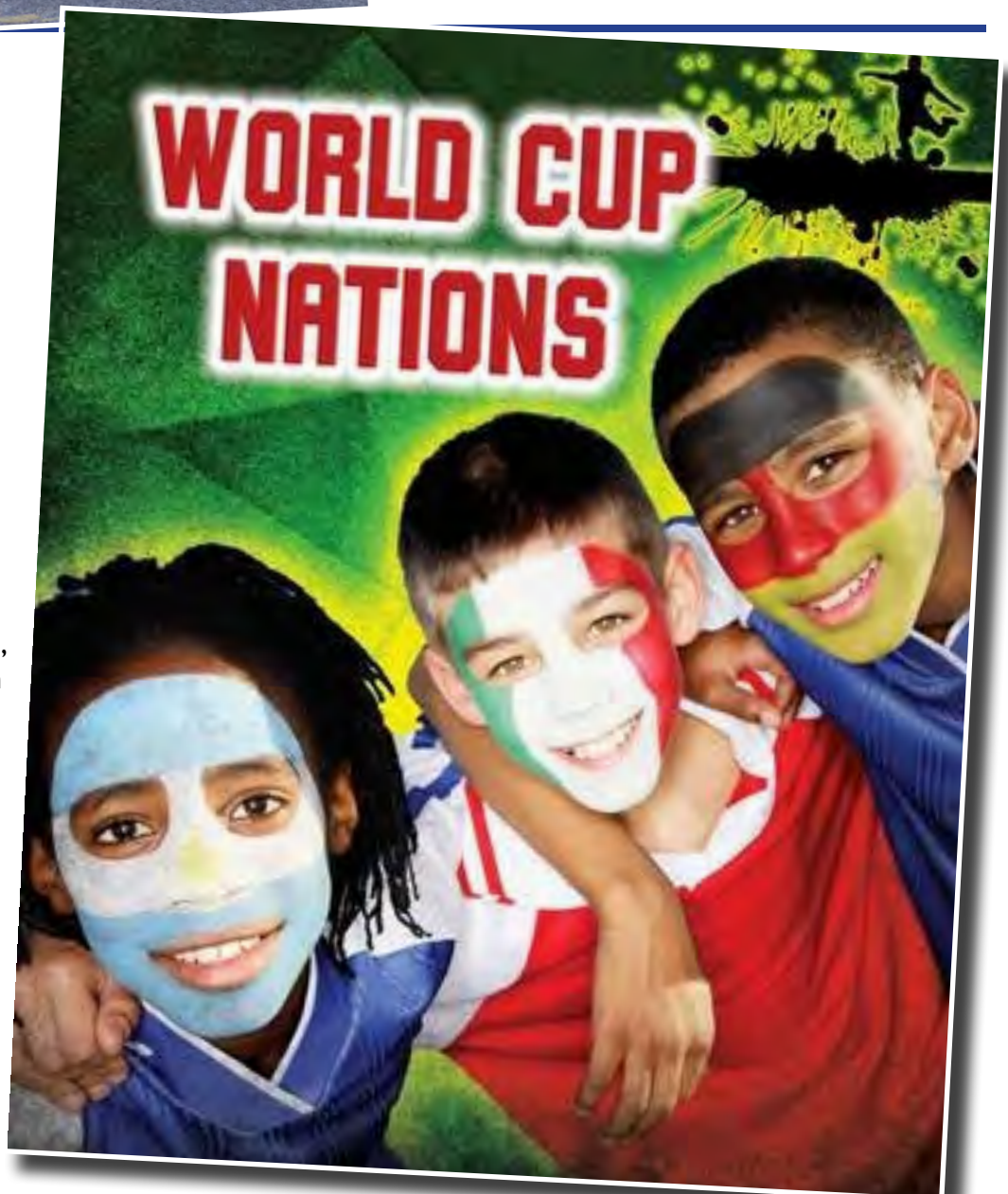
We have endeavoured to keep our uniform costs as low as possible for our families, but we are unfortunately no longer able to absorb these external price increases.
